

## Learning Activity for Sort the Veggies! Kindergarten

**Objective:** The students will be able to identify, sort and classify objects by attribute and identify objects that do not belong to a particular group.

**Materials:** Random assortment of objects to sort; buttons, plastic vegetables (preferably from the song), a variety of beans, etc.

### SORT THE VEGGIES!

Sort the veggies, sort them now.  
Sort each one you see.  
Sort by color, shape, and size.  
Sort them all with me.

Red or green, large or small,  
Long or round, let's sort them all.  
Sort the veggies that you see.  
Sort them all with me.

*Sort by color, here we go  
Sort the veggies now!*

Sort by color, sort them now.  
Spoken: Veggies that are green!  
Person 1: Cucumber!  
Person 2: Broccoli!  
Person 3: Spinach!

*Sung:*  
Sort by shape, sort them now.  
Spoken: Veggies that are round!  
Person 1: Pumpkin!  
Person 2: Brussel sprout!

Person 3: Lettuce

*Sung:*  
Sort by size, sort them now.  
*Spoken:* Veggies that are small!  
Person 1: Black eyed pea!  
Person 2: Lima bean!  
Person 3: Radish!

*Sung:*  
Sort the veggies, sort them now.  
Sort each one you see.  
Sort by color, shape, and size.  
Sort them all with me.

Red or green, large or small,  
Long or round, let's sort them all.  
Sort the veggies that you see.  
Sort them all with me.

Sort the Veggies, sort them all!

### Procedure:

- 1) Show students an assortment of objects.
- 2) Discuss with the students how they could sort the objects in groups.
- 3) Demonstrate an example of a sort.
- 4) Play the song.
- 5) Ask students if there is anything that they have to sort at home? (socks, laundry, mail, etc.)

**Evaluation:** Teacher observation when sorting a variety of objects. Ask students to describe their sort. Be sure that students realize that items can be sorted by different characteristics.
